It would be nice to have some older, more experienced employees.

Financials: Lyssa hasn't had a chance to run any numbers yet. She doesn't think they are in trouble. Business has been picking up. They need \$2400/day. Last week they were starting to run out of prepared food. Good! Still working with vendors to get support that we have paid for and expect. Still in grace period for mortgage. October will be the first full mortgage payment. \$30,000 in grants \$60,000 in loans. Locals are thinking of ideas to raise money to pay off the mortgage.
