

# **Incomplete List of Revolutionary War Veterans Associated with Putney, Windham, VT**

## **Levi Baldwin Sr.**

Levi Baldwin Sr. was a private in Cpt Bliss' company, Col Timothy Walker's regiment. At some point he was promoted to corporal, serving in Cpt Samuel Healy's company, Col John Jacobs' regiment. There exists a letter in which he requests a bounty coat or its equivalent in money from one of his superiors dated Roxbury, MA 26 Oct 1775. Levi was born on April 25th, 1753 in Rehoboth, MA and died January 1st, 1843 in Quebec, Canada. His parents were Thomas and Deborah Baldwin née Vickory. Levi was married twice; to Experience Goff on September 19th, 1776 in Rehoboth, MA, who died in 1815, and Abigail Mills in 1819 in Sherbrooke, QC, Canada. He and Experience were married in Rehoboth in 1776 and their first son, Zelotes, was born in Westminster in 1783, Levi and Experience moved to Putney some time in the late 1770s or early 1780s. The rest of Levi and Experience's children were born in Westminster or Putney, and Levi Jr. died in Westminster, so I estimate Levi as living in Putney or Westminster from ~1776 to ~1795.

## **Daniel Brown Sr.**

Daniel Brown Sr. was a private in James Clay II's militia. He was born January 2nd, 1756 in Connecticut or Putney and died October 1st, 1823 in Putney. His parents were Mary Brown née Haynes and Jethro Brown. Daniel and Lucy Alexander were married in Putney in May of 1778. Daniel lived in Putney for most of his life.

### **Seth Carey (alt sp Cary)**

Seth Carey was a private in Cpt Carey's company, Col Abbot's regiment. He was also a private under Gamaliel Bradford. Seth was born April 3rd, 1747 in Bridgewater, MA and died December 31st, 1829 in Putney, VT.

### **James Clay I**

James Clay I was the Chairman of the Cumberland County Committee of Safety in 1776 and the Putney representative to the convention of 1777 to discuss and decide on New York's claims to Vermont. James was born March 18th, 1718 in Ipswich, MA and died August 3rd, 1798 in Putney, VT. His parents were Jonas and Milliscent Clay née Kingsbury. James and Lydia Walker were married February 9th, 1744 in Rehoboth, MA. His headstone, located in Putney at the Old North Burying Ground, says that he moved his family to Putney from Rehoboth, MA in 1774.

### **James Clay II**

James Clay II was a private in Captain Lucas Wilson's company in 1777. In 1778 he was promoted to Captain of the Putney militia. James was born October 29th, 1751 in Rehoboth, MA and died in November of 1828 in Putney, VT. His parents were James and Lydia Clay née Walker. James II and Elizabeth Warner were married November 25th, 1779 in Putney. James moved to Putney with his family in 1774.

### **Aaron Cole**

Aaron Cole served as a private in Col William Williams' regiment from September 25th to October 17th, 1777. Aaron was born January 31st, 1755 in Swansea, MA and died January 7th, 1802 in Shaftsbury, VT. His parents were Israel and Susanna Cole née Wheaton.

### **James Crawford Jr. (alt sp Crofford)**

James Crawford Jr. served as a private in the Vermont militia. He was in Cpt John Petty's company, Col Benjamin Whitney's regiment. James was born in January of 1733 in Union, CT and died January 1st, 1807 in Putney, VT. His parents were James and Elizabeth Crawford née Campbell. James and Grace Carpenter were married. None of their children were born in Putney and the 1790 federal census lists his residence as Weston, CT, so he lived in Putney from after 1790 to 1807.

### **Daniel Cushing Sr.**

Daniel Cushing Sr. was second lieutenant in Cpt Lucas Wilson's company, Col. Patterson's regiment in August of 1778, October of 1779, and June of 1780. Daniel was born November 5th, 1744 in Rehoboth, MA and died March 16th, 1797 in Putney, VT. His parents were Josiah and Mehitable Cushing née King. Daniel and Patience Fairbrother were married September 26th, 1769 in Rehoboth, MA. All of their children except for Elizabeth were born in Putney, so I estimate the family as having moved to Putney in 1771 or 1772, after Elizabeth's birth but before Sarah's.

### **Joseph Cushing Sr.**

Joseph Cushing Sr. served as a private in Lt Moses Johnson's company, Col William Williams' regiment. Joseph was born February 7th, 1757 in Rehoboth, MA and died April 28th, 1811 in Putney, VT. His parents were Matthew and Abigail Cushing née Titus. Joseph was married twice; to Hannah Sabin in Feb of 1781 in Putney, who died in 1789, and Prudence Snow in March of 1790 in Putney. Joseph and some of his siblings were born in Rehoboth, but his two younger brothers were born in Putney, so I estimate Joseph to have moved to Putney with his family between 1762 and 1764. All of his children with both wives were born in Putney as well.

### **Matthew Cushing II**

Matthew Cushing II served as a private in Cpt James Clay II's company, Col Stephen Bradley's regiment. Matthew was also the town clerk of Putney in 1776. Matthew was born July 29th, 1730 in Rehoboth, MA and died in December of 1813 in Putney, VT. His parents were Matthew and Mary Cushing née Leavitt. Matthew was married twice; to Priscilla Smith in February of 1750 in Rehoboth, who died in 1751, and Abigail Titus on October 26th, 1751 in Rehoboth. Matthew Cushing II was Joseph Cushing Sr.'s father. Matthew's two youngest sons, Benjamin and Asaph, were born in Putney. The family likely moved to Putney between 1762 and 1764.

### **Daniel Gates Sr.**

Daniel Gates Sr. was a lieutenant in Cpt Boyden's company, Col William Williams' regiment. At some point he was promoted to sergeant, serving in Cpt Duncan's company, Col Sargeants regiment. Daniel was also on the Committee of Correspondence. Daniel was born March 2nd, 1751 in Worcester County, MA and died November 6th, 1807 in Oakham, MA. His parents were John and Violetta Gates née Rice. Daniel and Sarah Moore were married June 30th, 1775 in Worcester, MA. All of Daniel's children were born in Dummerston, and the 1800 federal census also lists Daniel's residence as Dummerston. Daniel and Sarah likely lived in Dummerston from 1775 to shortly after 1800.

### **Joseph Goodhue**

"The June after I was 17 years old I joined a volunteer company under the command of Capt. Blakly of Brattleborow, went to West Point; taried their a few days. While there was offered a comision in the United States Army, but declined accepting it...From West Point I went down the river to Kings ferry, 20 miles above New York, which was then in possession of the British Army. After remaining there a few days our Regiment was ordered up the Mohawk River..." Quoted from Goodhue's journal, published in the History and Proceedings of the Pocumtuck Valley Memorial Association Vol III, Annual Meeting 1890.

Joseph Goodhue was born October 13th, 1762 in Dunstable, MA and died November 12th, 1849 in Deerfield, MA. His parents were Josiah and Elizabeth Goodhue née Fletcher. Joseph was married twice; to Martha Clay on December 20th, 1784 in Massachusetts, who died in 1790, and Mindwell Taylor. Joseph farmed in Putney for some time, and he was also a town physician along with his older brother, Josiah Goodhue Jr. Joseph and Josiah Jr.'s father, Josiah Sr., was minister of Putney starting in October of 1776. All of Joseph and Martha's children were born in Putney, Martha died in Putney in 1795, and Joseph's two children with Mindwell were born in Deerfield, MA, so Joseph likely lived in Putney from ~1786 to ~1795.

### **Amos Haile Sr. (alt sp Hale)**

Amos Haile Sr. was a sergeant in Cpt John Petty's company, Col William Williams' regiment. Amos was born August 27th, 1743 in Swansea, MA and died in 1802 in Fairfield, Herkimer, NY. His parents were Walter and Mary Haile née Luther. He and Achsah Parker were married. All of their children were born in Putney, and Amos' residence is listed as Fairfield, NY on probate documents dated 21 May 1800, so Amos and his family likely lived in Putney from ~1769 to before 1800.

James Haile Sr. was a sergeant in Cpt James Clay II's company, Col Stephen Bradley's regiment. James was born October 30th, 1745 in Warren, RI and died May 4th, 1808 in Putney, VT. His

parents were Walter and Mary Haile née Luther. James and Hannah Hicks were married November 2nd, 1768 in Warren, RI.

### **Joseph Hartwell**

Joseph Hartwell was a private in Josiah Fish's company, Lt Moses Johnson's regiment. Joseph was born November 3rd, 1730 in Bedford, MA and died in March of 1803 in Lyndon, VT. His parents were William and Deborah Hartwell née Wheat. Joseph and Sarah Skinner were married June 1st, 1751 in Chelmsford, MA. Though not in Putney, all of Joseph and Sarah's children were born nearby in Westmoreland, NH. They likely lived there from 1751 to before 1790, when Joseph's residence is listed in 1790 federal census as Bedford, MA.

Ebenezer Houghton Sr. was a private and drummer in Cpt Robert Longley's company, Asa Whitcomb's regiment and in Cpt John Petty's company, Col William Williams' regiment. Ebenezer was born May 28th, 1750 in Bolton, MA and died May 28th, 1835 in Otsego County, NY. His parents were Cyrus and Merriam Houghton née Butler. Ebenezer and Hadassah Houghton were married September 26th, 1776 in Petersham, MA. All of their children were born in Putney, so they likely lived there from ~1778 to 1800, when Ebenezer's residence is listed as Leominster, MA in the 1800 federal census.

Jonathan Houghton II was a private in Col William Williams' regiment. Jonathan was born March 8th, 1752 in Leominster, MA and died August 30th, 1831 in Westminster, VT. His parents were Jonathan and Sarah Houghton née Houghton. Jonathan and Joanna Burgh (or Burge) were married January 24th, 1774 in Westminster, VT. Jonathan and Joanna were married in Westminster and all of their children were born there or in Putney, so Jonathan likely lived in either place for most of his life.

Elisha Hubbard was a corporal in Lt Moses Johnson's company, William Williams' regiment from September 25th to October 17th, 1777. Elisha was born April 28th, 1752 in Braintree, MA and died December 28th, 1834 in Rochester, VT. His parents were Peter and Desire Hubbard née Copeland. Elisha and Tamar Moore were married in 1773 in Putney and all of their children except the last two were born in Putney, so Elisha and his family likely lived in Putney from ~1774 to ~1799.

**Benjamin Hutchins Sr.**

Benjamin Hutchins Sr. served in Cpt James Clay II's company, Col Stephen Bradley's regiment. Benjamin was born January 11th, 1727 in Bradford, MA and died May 27th, 1813 in Putney, VT. His parents were William and Bethiah Hutchins née Carleton. Benjamin was married twice; to Lucy Davis on April 5th, 1757 in Harvard, MA, who died before 1777, and Sarah Minott. All of Benjamin's children with both wives, except the first two, were born in Putney. Benjamin likely moved to Putney with his family between 1762 and 1765, after Silence's birth but before Bulkeley's.

### **Joshua Hyde Sr.**

Joshua Hyde Sr. was a private in Lt Moses Johnson's company, Col William Williams' regiment. He and his son, also named Joshua, served in the same company and regiment. Joshua Hyde Sr. was born October 12th, 1723 in Newton, MA and died November 25th, 1794 in Putney, VT. His parents were Jonathan and Hannah Hyde née Dana. Joshua and Rebecca Hubbard were married May 2nd, 1751 in Worcester, MA. None of Joshua's children were born in Putney and the first record of him living there that I was able to find was the 1790 federal census, only about four years before his death. His last child was born in Templeton, MA, so it is possible the family moved there as early as 1765, but the only confirmed dates for Joshua living in Putney is 1790-1794.

Joshua Hyde Jr. was born in 1753 in Worcester County, MA and died March 28th, 1818 in Williamstown, VT. His parents were Joshua and Rebecca Hyde née Hubbard. Joshua and Sarah Graham were married. Joshua and Sarah's child was born in Putney, and the 1810 federal census lists Joshua's residence as Putney, so Joshua likely lived there from ~1788 to after 1810.

### **Daniel Jewitt Sr. (alt sp Jewett)**

Daniel Jewitt Sr. was 1st Lieutenant under Captains Abijah Moore and Leonard Spaulding. He was also a prisoner of war at one point, but I was unable to find where and for how long. Daniel was born February 24th, 1743 in Manchester, MA and died March 30th, 1839 in Putney, VT. His parents were Benjamin and Hannah Jewitt née Butler. Daniel and Zilpah Hibbard were married in 1769 in Windham, CT. According to *History and Genealogy of the Jewetts*, Daniel, Zilpah, and their two oldest children moved to Putney in 1774 and purchased 100 acres.

Moses was born February 23rd, 1741 in Connecticut and died September 5th, 1835 in Putney, VT. His parents were Nathan and Mary Johnson née Russell. Moses was married twice; to Margaret Kathan on January 26th, 1764 in Brattleboro, VT, who died before the war, and Lydia Wheeler on November 17th, 1789 in Chesterfield, NH.

Seth was born September 28th, 1755 in Dighton, MA and died September 10th, 1824 in Meigs County, OH. His parents were Elijah and Deborah Jones née Austin. Seth was married twice; to Sarah Pitts in 1778 in Dighton, MA, who died before 1810, and Esther Adams on August 26th, 1810 in Meigs County, OH.

Amos and Sarah's children were born in Putney, so he likely lived in Putney from about 1788 to 1837.

Charles Kathan was Lieutenant Colonel in Col Stephen Bradley's regiment. Charles was born March 26th, 1743 in Worcester, MA and died May 22nd, 1793 in Putney, VT. His parents were John and Martha Kathan née Baird. Charles and Elizabeth Moore were married in 1768 in Putney, VT. All of Charles and Elizabeth's children were born in Putney, so Charles likely lived in Putney from ~1768 until his death in 1793. However, his mother died in Dummerston in 1766, so he could have moved to the Putney area with his family before marrying Elizabeth.

### **Daniel Keyes**

Daniel Keyes was a private in Cpt John Cole's company, Col Ashley's regiment. He was a private in Cpt Kimball Carlton's company, Moses Nichols' regiment. His final term of service was as a private in Cpt James Clay II's company, Col Stephen Bradley's regiment. Daniel signed the NH Association Test in 1776. At the outbreak of the Revolution, colonies tasked town selectmen with ensuring that as many white men over the age of 21 signed the test, as a sign of loyalty to the Colonies. This process was known as the Association Test.
